

A NO VOTE allows the state government through the legislative process to con- tinue to allocate budgeted funds for the purposes of buying and improving land and water conservation proper- ties. Currently there is no requirement that 33% of tax revenues from excise taxes on documents be used for this purpose.

Obamacare (Affordable Care Act) ⁴	S SUPPORT	O OPPOSE	O OPPOSE	S SUPPORT	AMENDMENT 2 Use of Marijuana for “Any Condition”	A YES VOTE legalizes the smoking of mar- ijuana in all 67 Florida counties for “any condition”, which could include fatigue, depression, body aches, nausea, pain, and headaches. Any person at least 21 years of age could be considered a “caregiver” and sell the drug without a prescription. There are no age restric- tions or parental consent requirements, so minor children would be eligible to buy and smoke marijuana without their parents’ permission.	A NO VOTE allows Florida’s current law against buying, selling and smoking marijuana to remain in effect. Voting against this amendment will not affect the 2014 law which was passed in the state legislature and allows for a special strain of non-euphoric medical marijuana in a pill to be prescribed by physicians to treat children with certain seizures and to be used for other debilitating medical conditions.

A NO VOTE requires the Governor to wait until the date that an existing judge’s term expires and an actual vacancy in the court occurs before he/ she could start the process of finding a new judge. Currently, a vacancy on the court occurs for a period of time after an existing judge retires because the Governor is not allowed to begin the process of replacing the existing judge until after the date of his/her retirement.
